



## Congratulations to Whangawehi Catchment Group - 2017 Green Ribbon Supreme Award Winners.

The award was announced on 8 June by Environment Minister Dr Nick Smith and Associate Conservation Minister Nicky Wagner. The Whangawehi Catchment Management Group was thrilled to win the Caring for Our Water Award, then were completely overwhelmed when they were announced as the Supreme Winner.

HBRC Chairman Rex Graham says, "I'm absolutely

hectares of native bush, and designed debris dams to capture silt. The result: increased schools of whitebait, more long fin eels and a 15% increase in the recreational status of the water quality. Hawke's Bay Regional Council is involved in the group and supports a project manager.

"This Supreme Award for a community-led waterway clean-up is important as it signals what is needed across thousands of rivers and streams across New Zealand. The Whangawehi Catchment Management Group is a powerful model of what is possible," said Minister for the Environment, Dr Smith.
